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Section 1. Overview and Scores

Executive Summary

The HAPLR II Index is featured in the September 1999 issue of American Libraries magazine. The Index uses data provided by nearly 9,000 public libraries in the United States to create comparative rankings. The comparisons are in broad population categories with breaks at 1,000; 2,500; 5,000; 10,000; 25,000; 50,000; 100,000; 250,000; and 500,000. The two distinctions between the first and second editions of the Index are the number of libraries included: 7,000 in the first edition, nearly 9,000 in the second; and the population categories used, four in the first edition, 10 in the second. Both editions are based on the same data from the Federal-State Cooperative Service (FSCS).

The attached report compares all 16 libraries in Waukesha County to one another as well as to comparable libraries in the nation. It should also be noted that **the state of Wisconsin ranked number 4** of all the States for the HAPLR Index. The group of libraries listed here all had extraordinarily high scores.

Each index factor produces a rank and percentile score. All factors are ranked from high to low EXCEPT cost per circulation. It is assumed that the best cost per circulation is the lowest cost.

Thomas J. Hennen Jr., the author of the HAPLR Index, has nearly 25 years worth of experience in public libraries. He has published in Library Journal, American Libraries and in other American Library Association publications. He also had a column on rural library materials for the American Library Association's Booklist magazine. He has been a speaker for library associations throughout the U.S. and Canada. He is the Director of the Waukesha County Federated Library System.

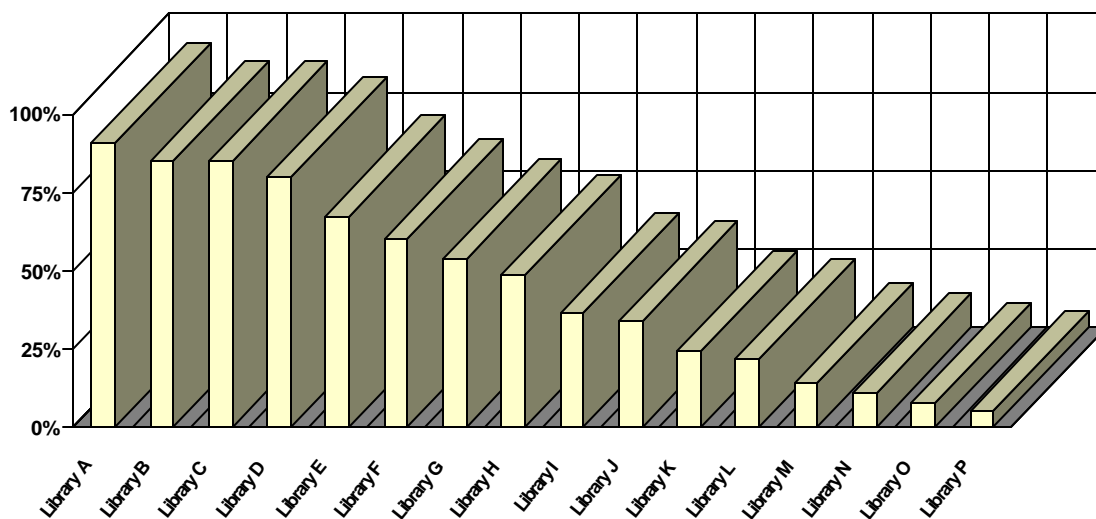
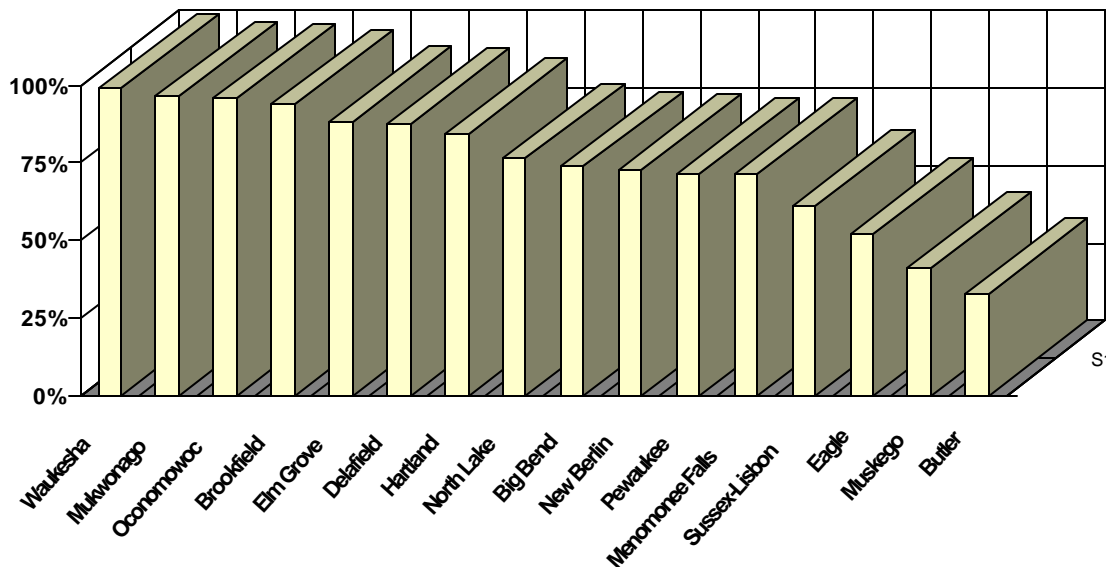
The data attached include the raw data taken from the Federal State Cooperative Service, a division of the U.S. Department of education, as well as the calculations that are needed to generate the HAPLR Index.

Section 2. Data Measures by Library for HAPLR Scores

Explanation of Data

The FSCS data elements listed in this report are a bit obscure, so there is an explanation table in the appendix.

Federal State Cooperative Service Data goes through three stages:

- ✓ Preliminary Release
- ✓ Early Release
- ✓ Final Release

HAPLR Index I was based on 1997 **Preliminary Release Files** from the Federal-State Cooperative Service. In most cases this will be data for calendar or fiscal year 1997. Nearly 2,000 libraries of 9,000 nationally could not be included because they did not report at least one data element needed to compile the Index. HAPLR I used only 4 population divisions rather than the 10 preferred by FSCS and used for HAPLR Index II.

HAPLR Index II uses data the more complete data obtained from **1997 Early Release files**. The data collection methods employed by FSCS allow for imputing (or statistically estimating) data in their Early Release files, allowing comparisons to most of those remaining libraries identified. This increases the number of libraries that can be rated from around 7,000 to 9,000. HAPLR Index II employs the 10 standard population divisions used by FSCS rather than the 4 used in the first edition.

The data will be probably not be published in final form by the federal government until 2000, but the raw data is available at the FSCS web sited at <http://nces.ed.gov/surveys/public.html#contents>.

The graphs compare each library to comparable libraries throughout the country. For each factor the graph illustrates the library's percentile score. A 50th percentile score means half of all libraries in the group scored higher, half lower.

The libraries in the population category were ranked with weighted scores for each factor to produce the composite HAPLR Index score, rank and cumulative percentile noted above.

Note that all factors are ranked from high to low EXCEPT cost per circulation. It is assumed that the best cost per circulation is the lowest cost.

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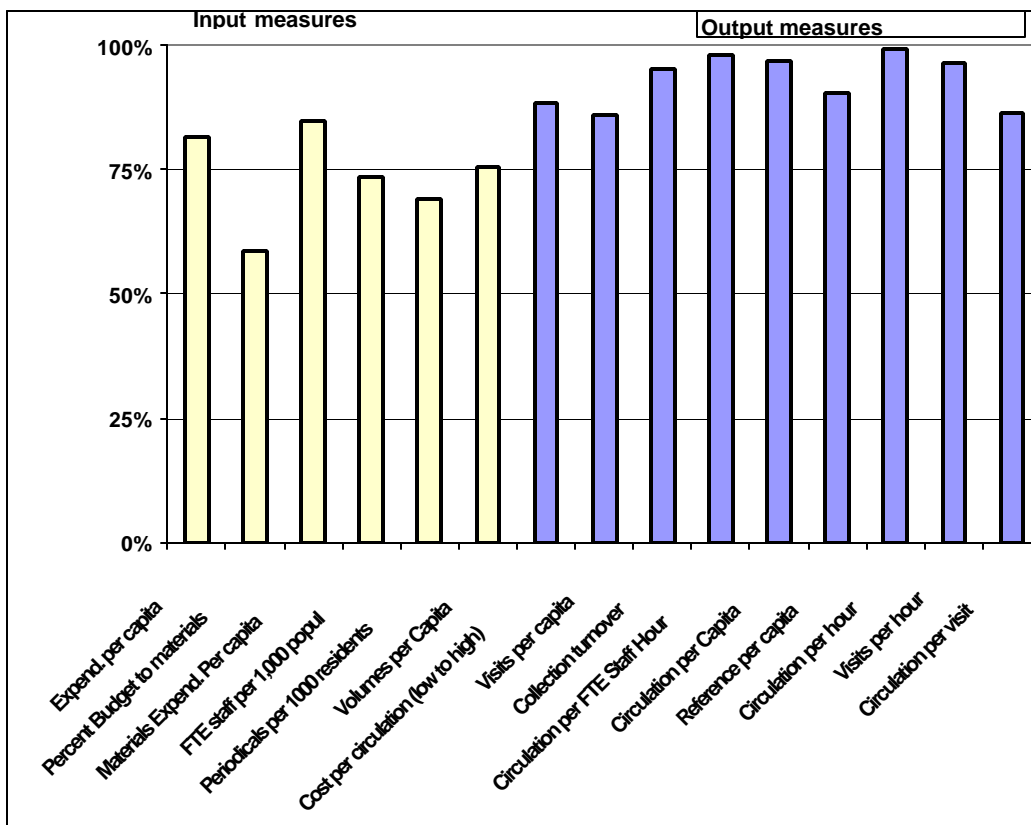
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Graph 1 Waukesha Public Library – 50 K

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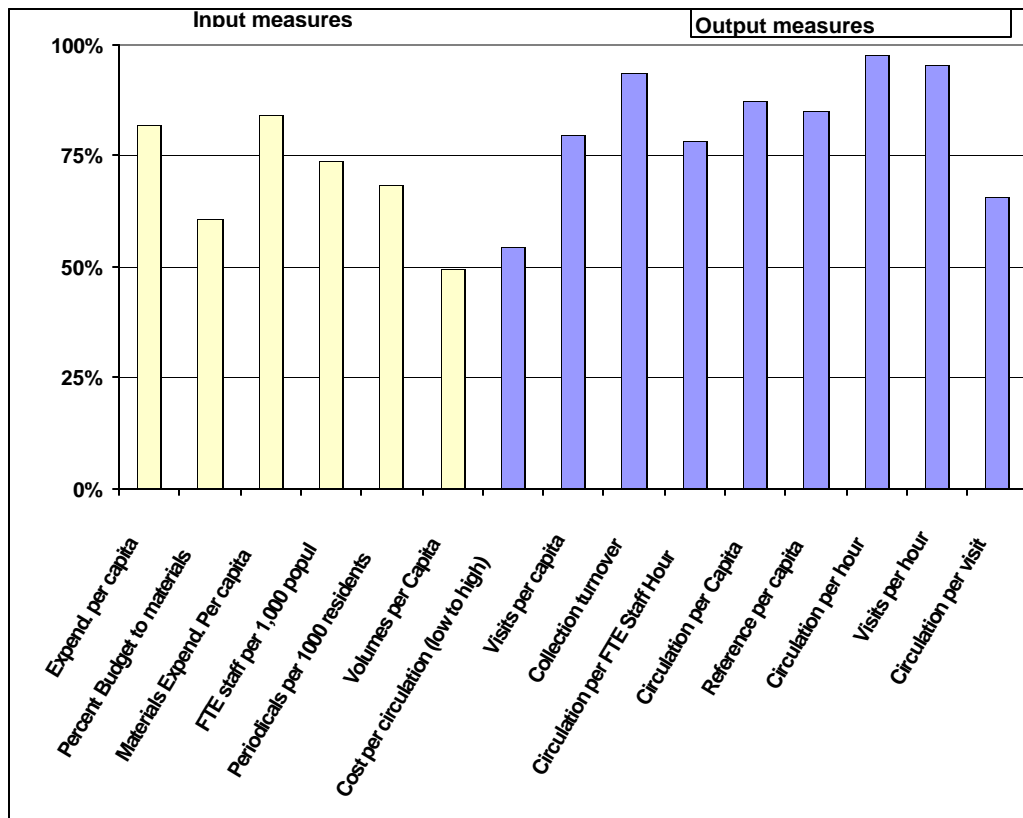
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Graph 2. Brookfield Public Library – 25K

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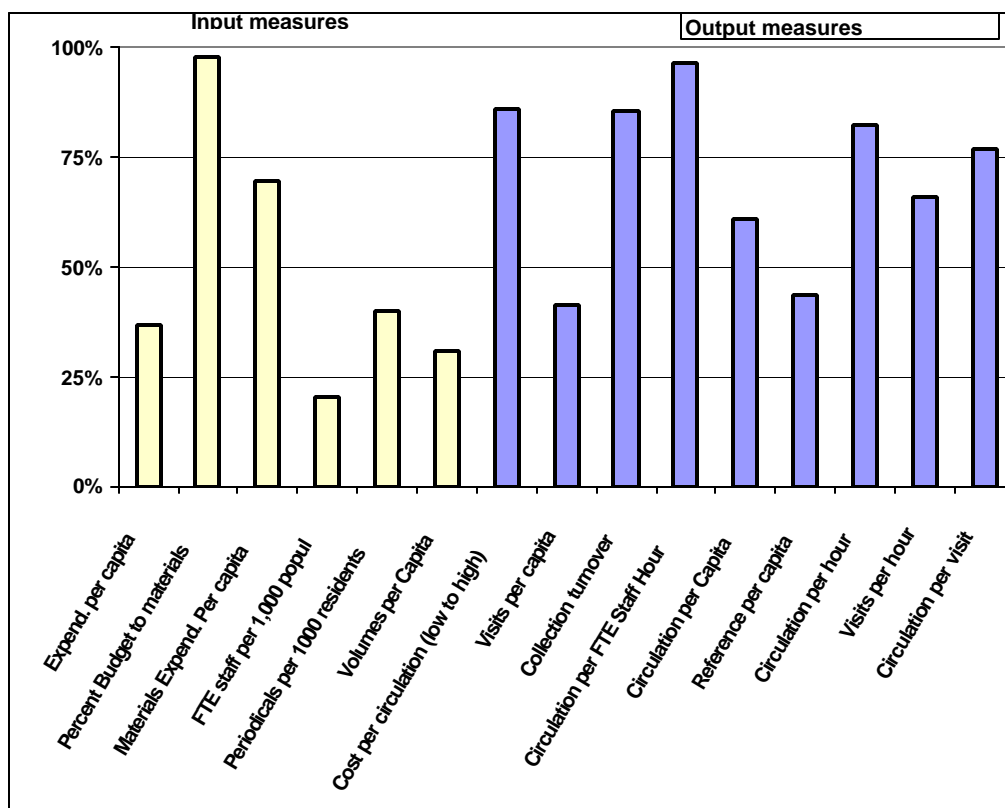
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Graph 3. New Berlin Public Library – 25 K

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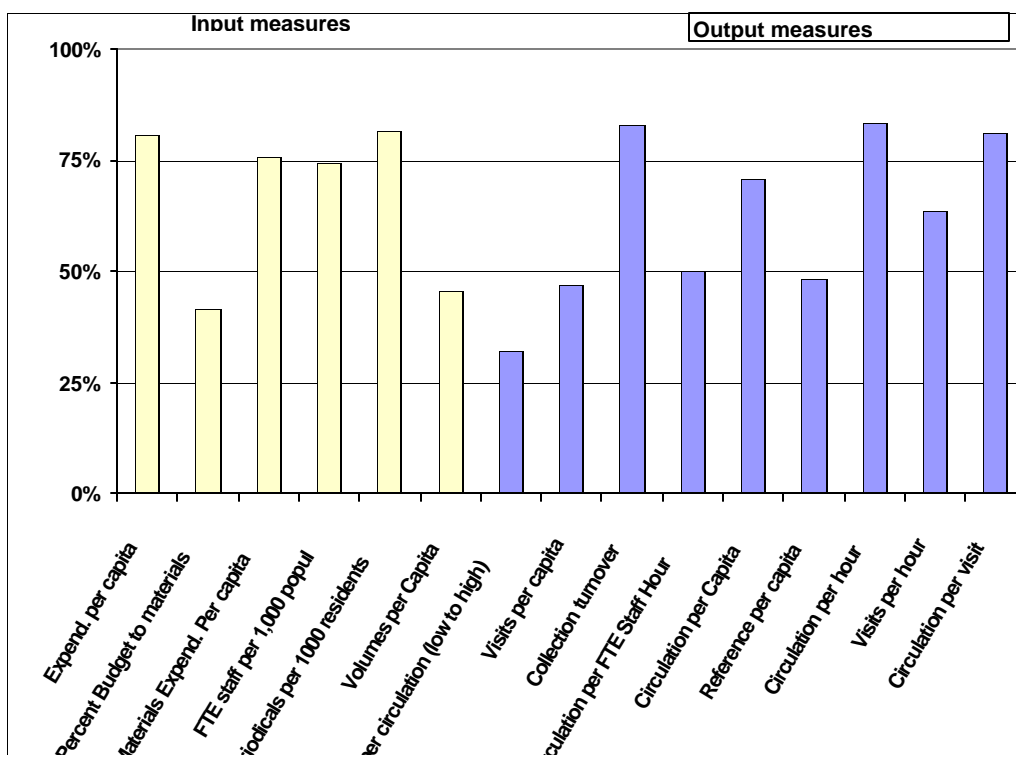
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Graph 4. Maude Shunk Library (Menomonee Falls) – 25 K

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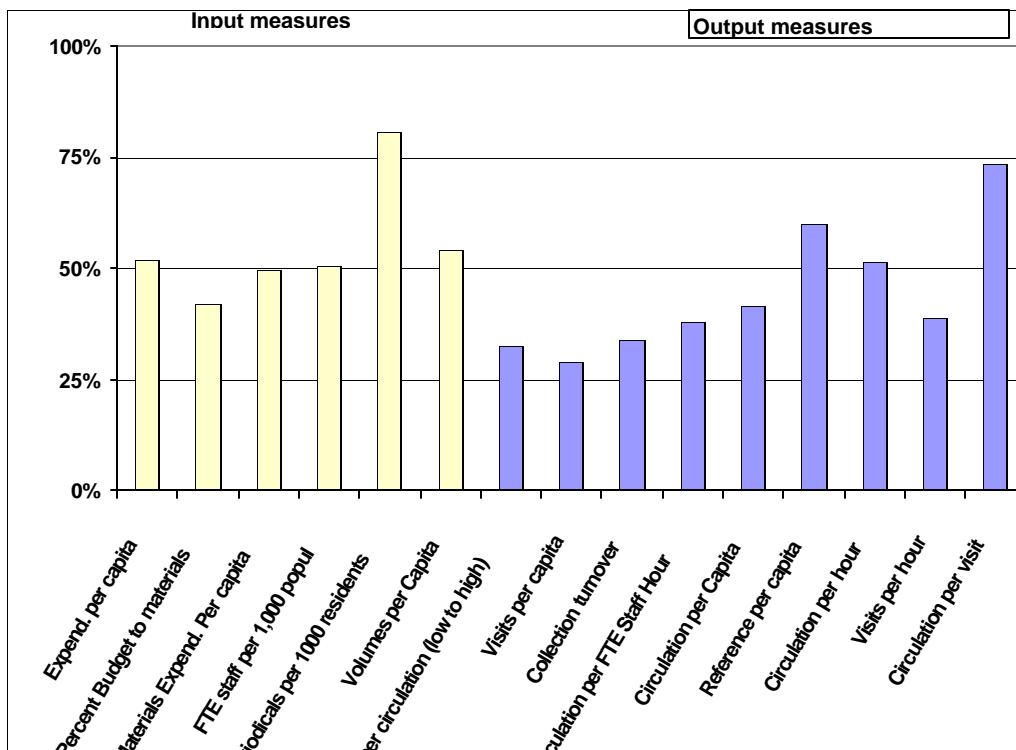
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Graph 5. Muskego Public Library – 25 K

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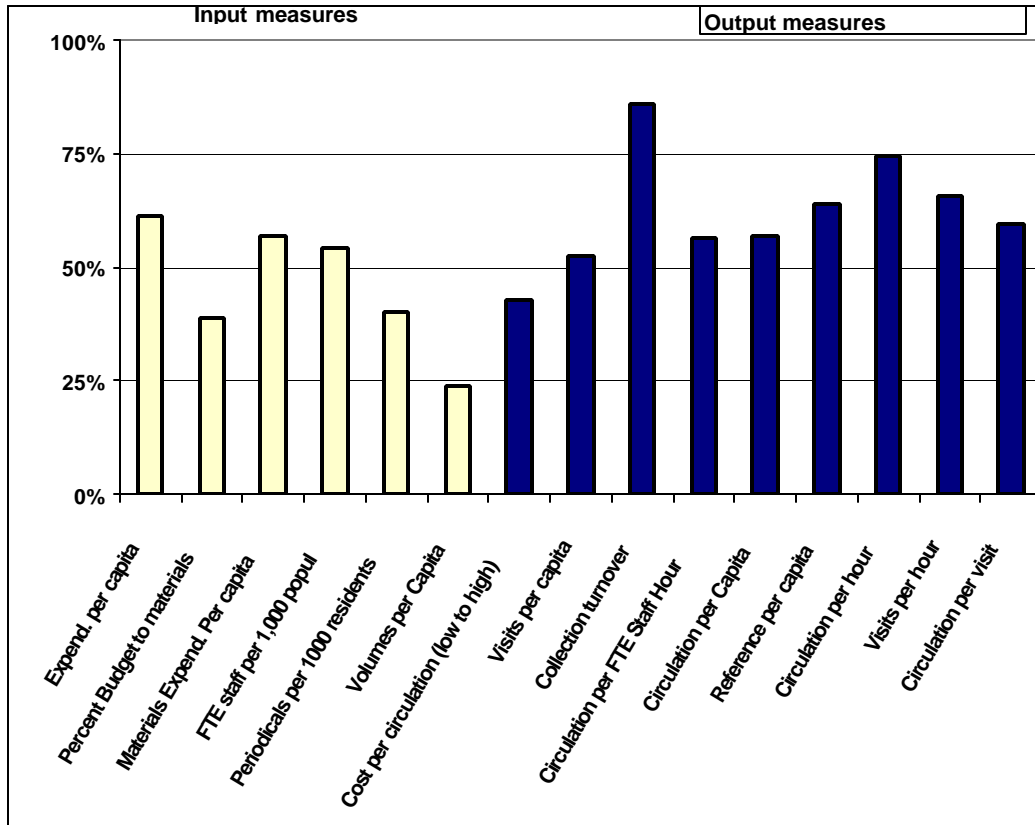
Graph 6. Pauline Haass (Sussex-Lisbon) 10K

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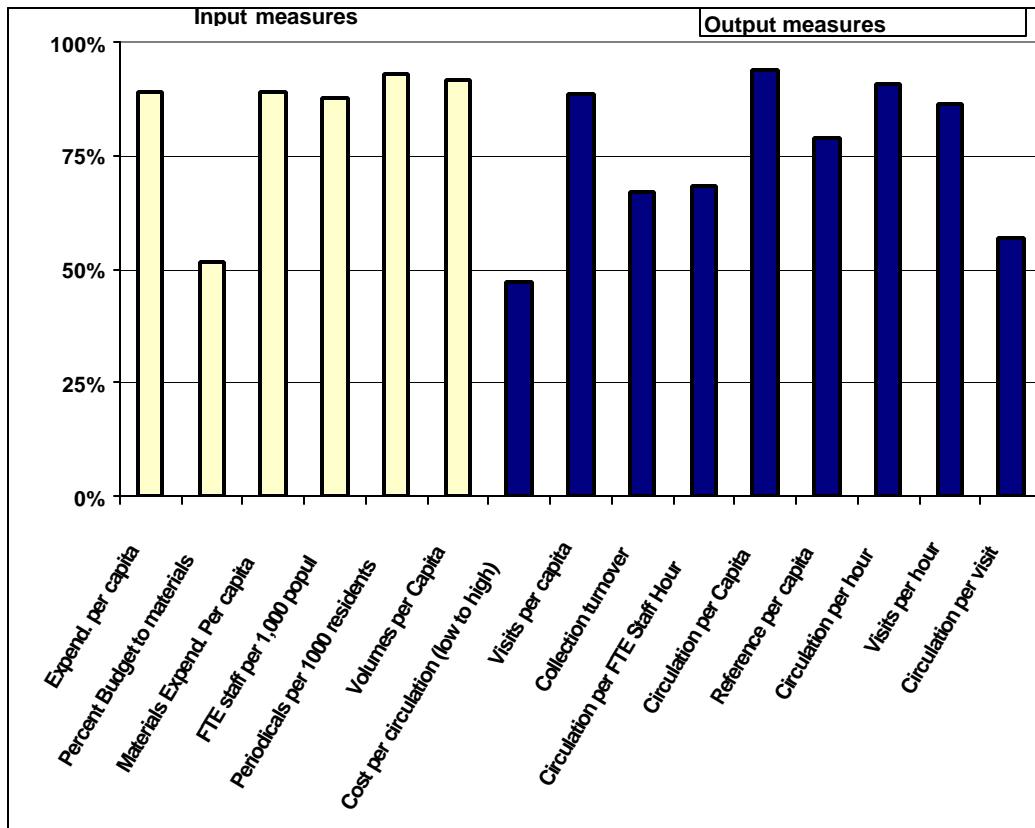
Graph 7. Oconomowoc Public Library 10K

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Graph 8. Hartland Public Library - 10K

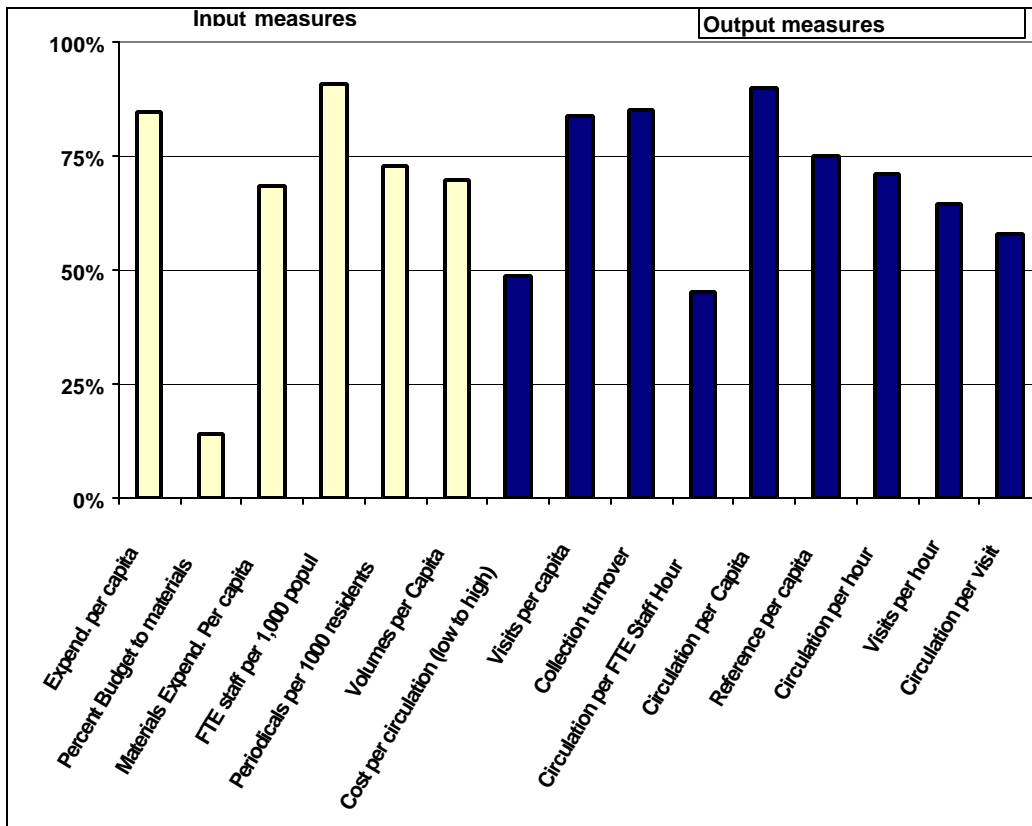

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Graph 9. Town Hall Library (North Lake) - 5 K

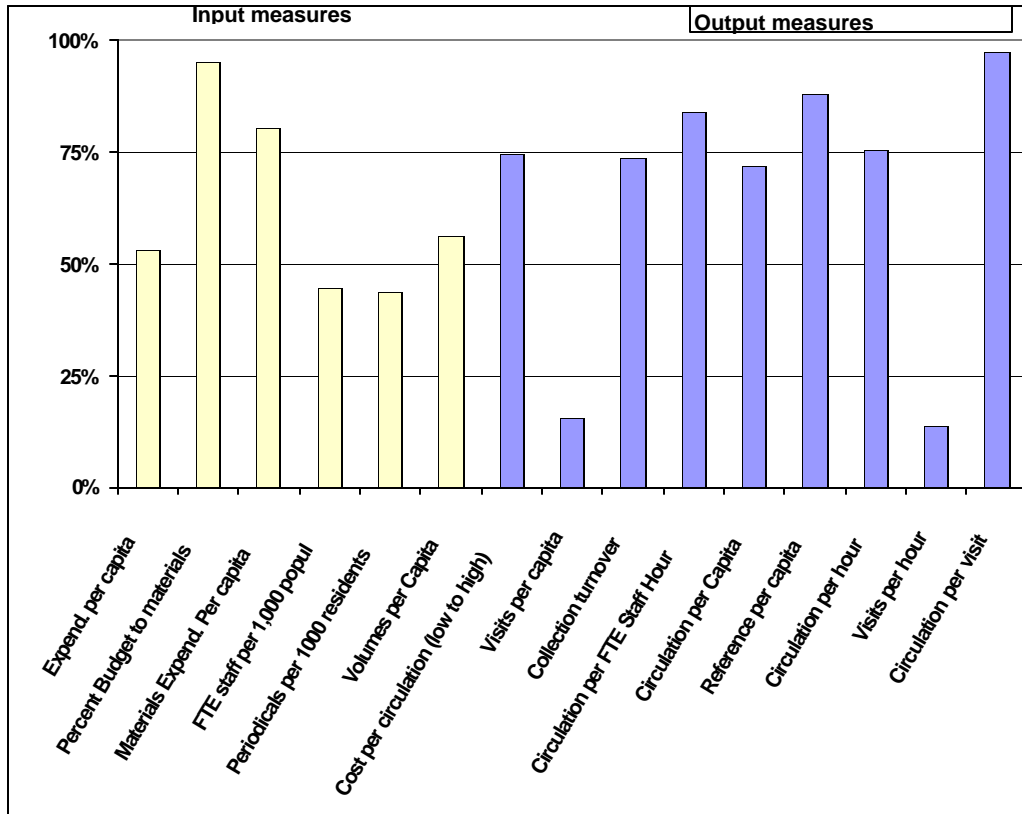

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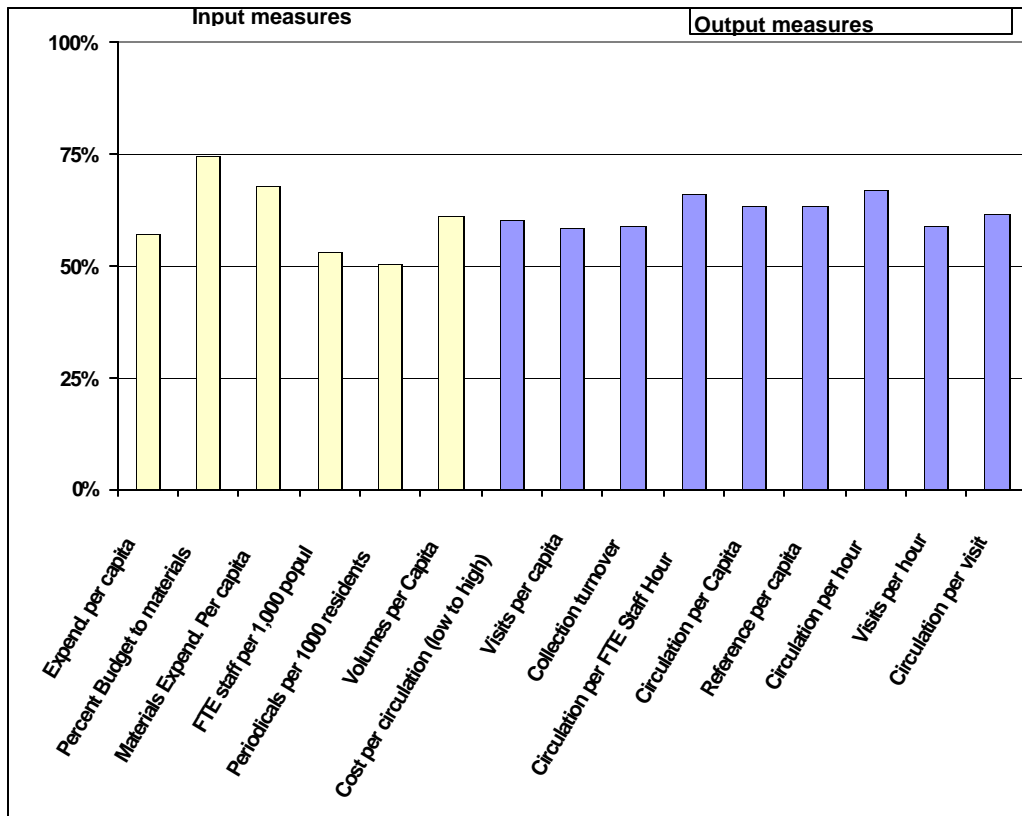
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Graph 10. Barbara Sanborn (Pewaukee) – 5 K

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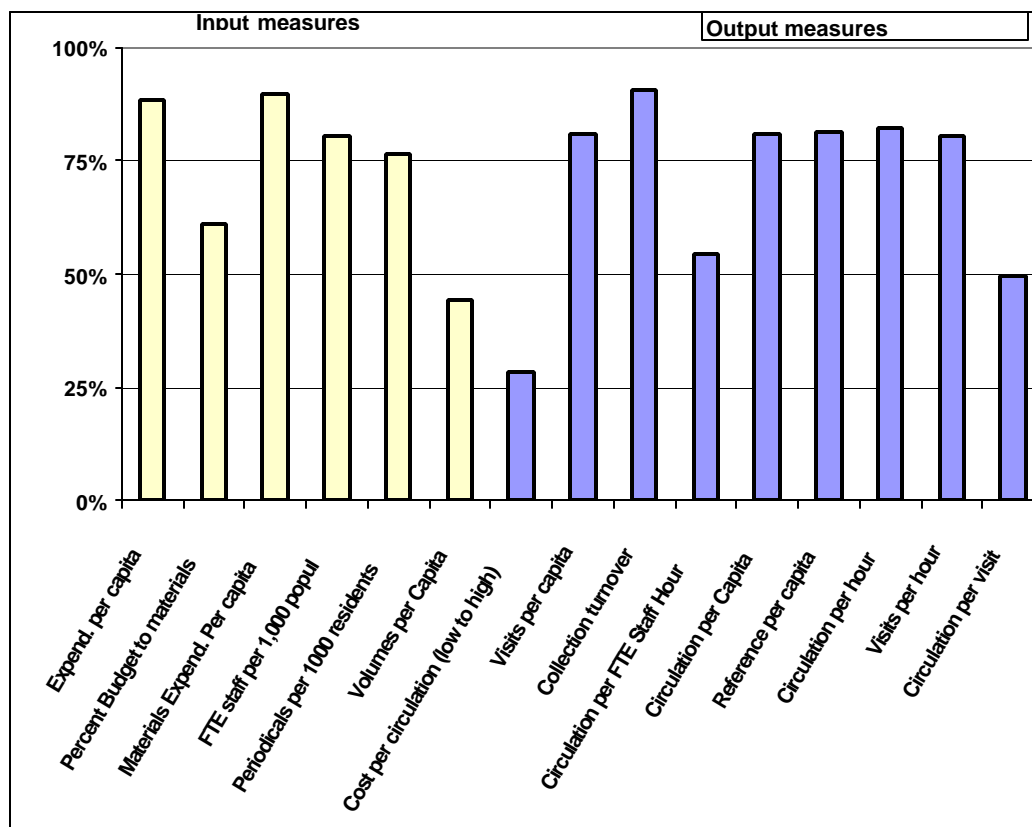
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Graph 11. Elm Grove Library – 5K

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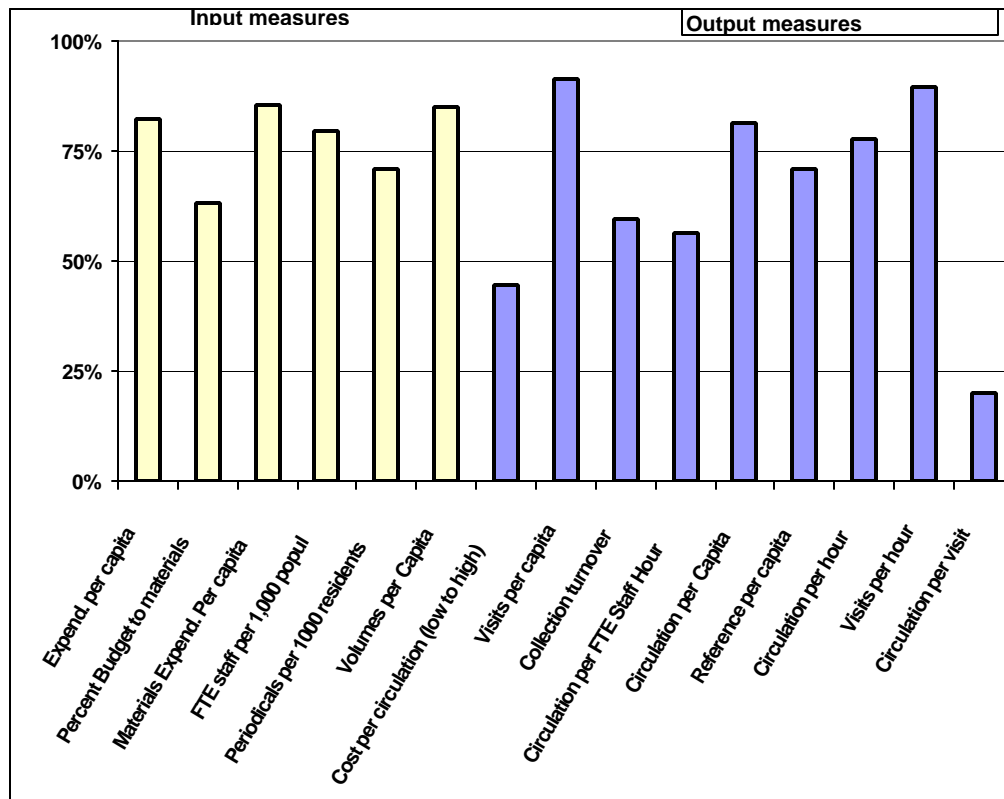
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Graph 12. Delafield Public Library - 5K

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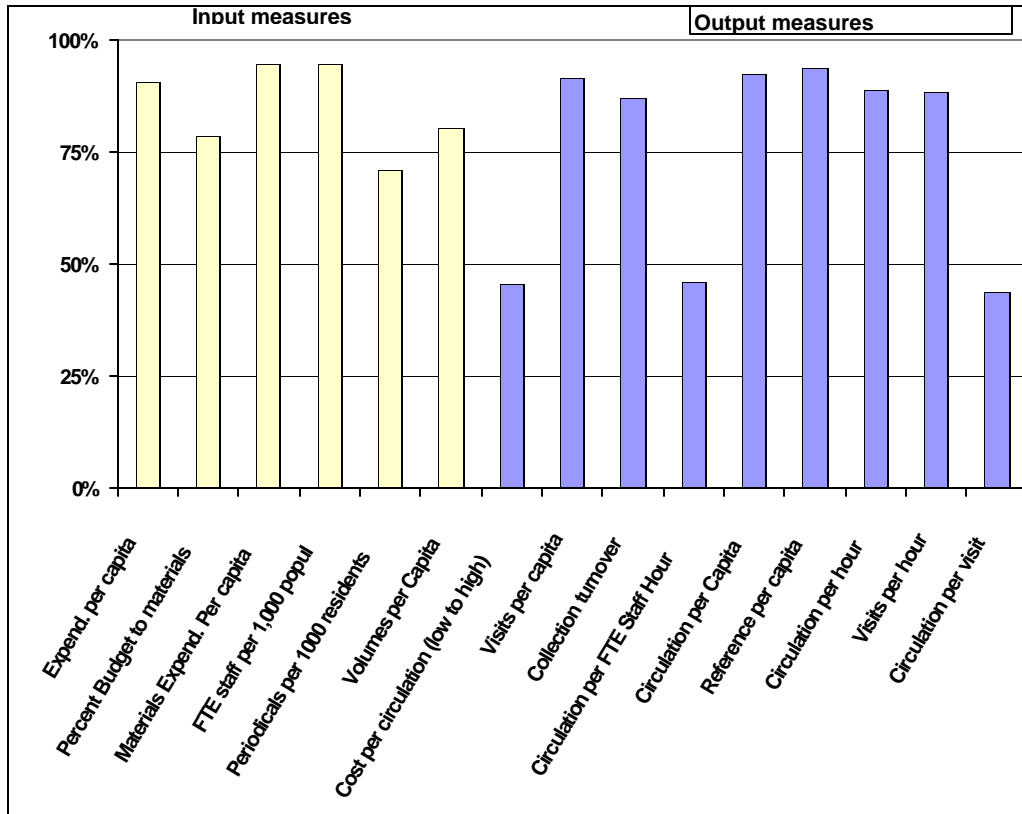
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Graph 13. Mukwonago Community Library – 5K

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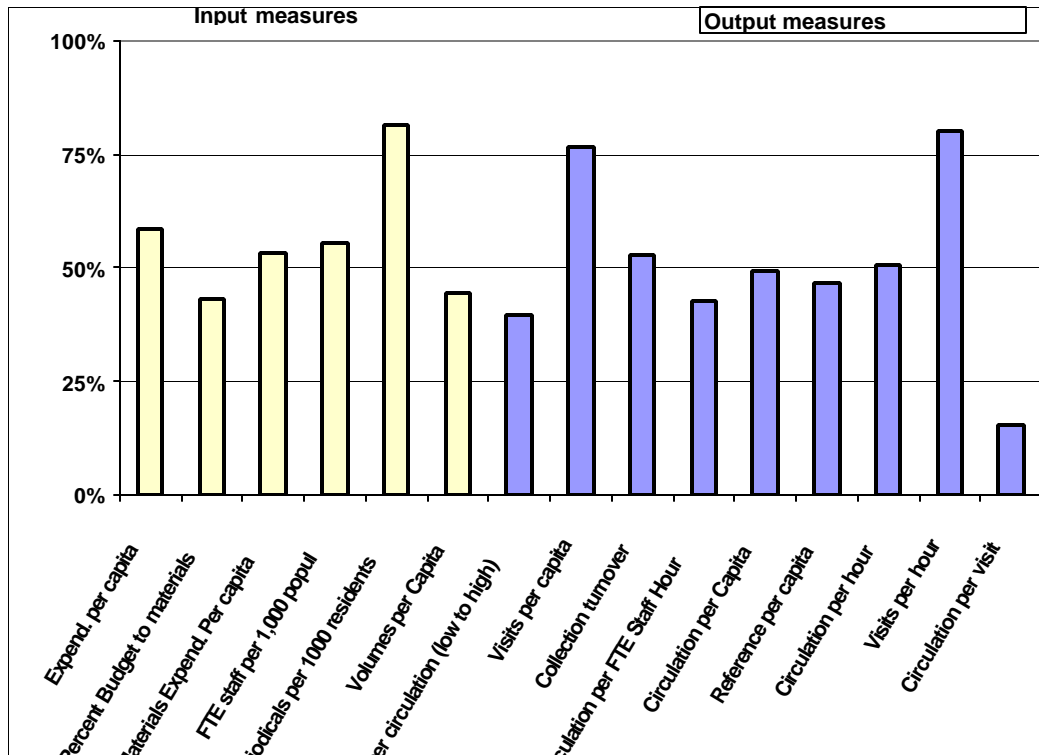
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Graph 14. Alice Baker (Eagle) Library –2.5K

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Graph 15. Butler Public Library – 2.5 K

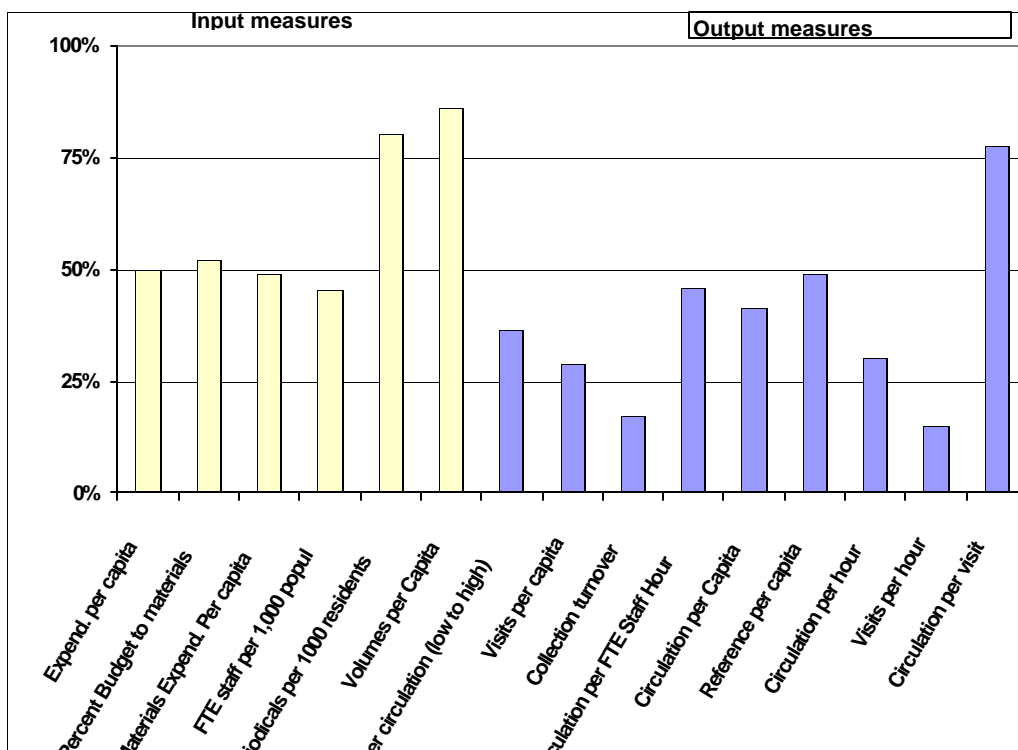

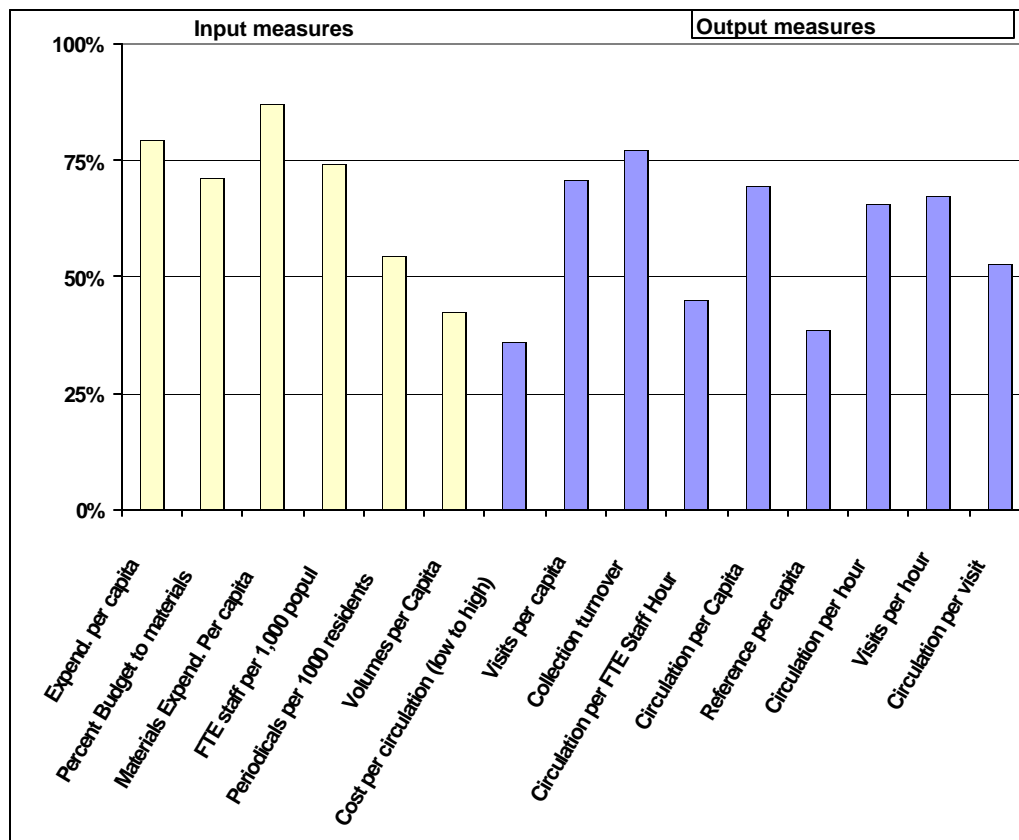
